2ND INTERNATIONAL COLT'S-I.U. POLICE COMBAT PISTOL MATCH

LOCATION:

Center for Police Training range, Bloomington, Indiana.

REGISTRATION:

No fee charges. Matches are open to all police officers.

ENTRIES:

No fee charges. Advance entries are required. Entries will close

12:00 Noon, June 7, 1960.

MATCH 1:

Individual match fired as squadded.

MATCH # 2:

Fourman team match fired as squadded.

MATCH # 3:

Individual 10 shot PPC match.

MATCH # 4:

All agency match. (First, second and third place 4 man teams from the Federal, State, County and Municipal level of policing. Match

4 will be shot on Sunday afternoon, June 12, 1960.

WEAPON:

.38 caliber revolver only, not to exceed a 6" barrel with adjustable or fixed sights, the weapon must be a SERVICE REVOLVER within the rules and regulations of the shooter's department.

AMMUNITION:

Any ball or wadcutter ammunition. To be supplied by the individual

shooter. (Standard loads only)

COURSE:

Indiana University Practical Pistol Course, i.e.: Ten rounds DOUBLE ACTION hip shooting at 7 yards in 25 seconds; Fifteen rounds DOUBLE ACTION kneeling, weak hand and strong hand barricade at 25 yards in 90 seconds; Twenty rounds SINGLE ACTION sitting, prone, weak and strong hand barricade at 50 yards in 2 minutes and 45 seconds; Five rounds SINGLE ACTION prone at 60 yards in 35 seconds. (The course of fire for the 10 shot PPC match will be the same as above except that only one live round will be fired from each of the 10 shooting positions. All weapons will be loaded with four dummies and one live round at

each position.)

OPEN TO:

Individuals and one or more teams, composed of four (4) members of any organized Police Department of any City, Town, Borough, Village, County, State or Sheriff's Office. Also regularly organized Railroad and Industrial Police and Guards, Bank Teams, Prison Guards, Armored Car Guards, County Detectives and Investigators, Court Officers, Customs Agents, Department of Justice, Federal Bureau of Investigation, Secret Service, Treasury Agents, or any other law enforcing Agents of the Municipal, County, State or Federal Governments. The individual or team members competing in the matches must be full time salaried employees of the organization they represent. Civilian or Military teams will not be allowed to compete.

TARGET:

Standard Colt Silhouette target modified for this match. The target has two vertical lines three and one half inches apart extending from the point of the chin to the bottom of the 5 ring. There is also a six inch circle in the center of the chest. This entire area is designated as the

5-X ring and is used to break possible ties.

	PRIZES:	Over \$3,000.00 in guns, trophies, prizes and awards. High team and high individual traveling trophies for all matches. Traveling trophies have to be won any aggregrate of three years before being permanently retired. Certificates of award and membership in the Center for Police Training "100" Club to individuals who shoot a possible score of 100 in any match. Brassards will be available at no cost to shooters.	
	CLOTHING:	Departmental uniforms are encouraged to add to the color of the matches. In any event clothing should be suitable for firing the practical pistol course.	
	HOUSING:	University dormitory and hotel space as well as other motel and hotel accommodations are available.	
	MEALS:	Meals and refreshments available at the range, at reasonable cost, served by Indiana University. No alcoholic beverages will be sold or permitted on University property which includes the ranges.	
	ALIBIS:	NONE. This is a combat pistol match.	
	SPECIAL FEATURES:	Friday evening, June 10, 1960, annual meeting of International Police Firearms Instructor Association. Time and place to be announced. Saturday evening, June II, 1960, a panel discussion on Combat Firearms Training Problems. Time and place to be announced.	
	recreational facilities:	The Center for Police Training's Skeet and Trap range will be open to all who desire to shoot. A representative will be present to instruct in the art of skeet and trap shooting. Cost for one round of trap or skeet is \$3.50.
